Hon. His special interests are pecuniary and non-pecuniary compensation for the victims affected by the violence and strategic national security plans aimed to help alleviate those victims. As former Senator of Pattani province by winning a large margin of electoral votes in 2006, it proves that he is popularity among the people within the constituency. It is undeniable that with his great understanding of the situation in the province, his expertise in peace and national security, and his ability to reach out to the public in multifaceted areas, the current situation in the province has improved.
